Prayer suggestions and activities:

The Season of Creation starts on September 1 and finishes on the feast of St. Francis of Assisi October 4:

- Use St. Francis' Canticles of Creation to explore his love of the earth and all creatures.
- · Write your own litanies and prayers of intercession for creation, praying that all may be compassionate and loving stewards of Gods creation.
- We pray for those who currently do not show a reverent use of resources and spoil creation. May their hearts be turned towards creating a better world.
- We pray that those in positions of power and responsibility, lead with compassionate hearts, responding with love to those in greatest
- We pray for the fruits of human work, especially those who work the land and sea. May their love shown towards tending their crop provide a bountiful harvest for all.
- September 26 Little Way Week. We pray that we may be inspired always to carry small acts of kindness with great love.
- St. Bernadette Pray the rosary especially during the month of October.



Explore it

Linking Compassionate and Loving to scripture, meaning and teachings of the Church, Pope Francis and the Saints.

Activities and Questions: -

- October I—The Feast Day of St. Therese of Lisieux. Research St. Therese of Lisieux, especially focusing on her charism 'Do small things with great love'.
- October 4 The Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi. Explore how St. Francis showed love and compassion for all of God's creation especially those who are poor and marginalised.
- Explore the life of Mary especially during the month of October.
- Reflect upon those stories of Mary, the model of a loving mother and mother of the Church on earth.
- Explore the devotion to Mary and the many places where she appeared for example Lourdes and Fatima.
- St. Bernadette Explore the story of St. Bernadette. Consider how her life inspires the compassion and love towards others in Lourdes
- Explore the CAFOD resource for Pope Francis' Encyclical Laudato Si' Laudato Si' encyclical resources | CAFOD and Fratelli Tutti Fratelli Tutti animation and resources for schools | CAFOD.
- Explore the needs of the local area/Parish e.g. food poverty.
- Explore the Spiritual and Corporal acts of mercy. How can you be faithful to these today?



Live it

Linking Compassionate and Loving to the way we can choose to live our lives to serve God and to serve others.

Activities and challenges:

- Consider how your school is caring for creation by living simply, sustainability and in solidarity with others.
- What actions can you take within your local area to show compassion towards nature around you? (e.g. making a bird feeder).
- October 15 The Feast of St. Teresa of Avila, She said 'Christ has no body but yours'. How can you use this phrase to live out Christ's mission on earth?
- We are all made in the image and likeness of God. How can we use our God given gifts to show compassion and love to others?
- September 26- Participate in Little Way Week, carrying out daily acts of compassion and love towards others.
- Make a rosary to support praying the rosary especially during the month of October.
- Start a school vegetable patch, consider how you will share the produce either gifting it to those less fortunate or selling it and donating the proceeds to charity.
- What can you do to support the needs of the local Parish? E.g. support the foodbank.
- Enquire if a local parish has a St. Vincent de Paul society, join together in a charitable outreach project.
